

Disability Inclusion Toolkit

The Disability Inclusion Toolkit is a series of publications which provide practical guidance about supporting disabled students. The Toolkit is underpinned by the social model of disability, which says that people are disabled by the world around them, rather than by their impairment or difference. The Toolkit focuses on inclusive practices, which can be implemented to support all students. Inclusive practices also help us to meet our anticipatory duties to make reasonable adjustments under the Equality Act 2010.
